Communication: To help save on paper, every effort is made to send communication from the office home electronically. Extra copies of all information e-mailed or sent home in paper form will be available

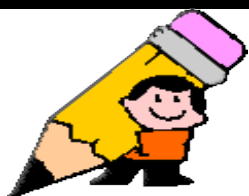

SAFE ARRIVAL PROGRAM at KEATING ELEMENTARY

The purpose of the Safe Arrival Program is to assure parents that their children arrive safely at school. All information provided is confidential.

The policy formed by the Keating Home & School Association requests that every student enrolled in the school be on the Call Back System. If you do not wish your child to be on the program, please let the office know.

How the system works:

- ◆ When your child is going to be absent from school for any reason, parents phone 250-652-1312 before 8:40 a.m. A recorded message will be heard that will tell you that you have reached Keating School's Call Back System. Please leave the date, your child's name, their division number and their teacher's name;
- ◆ A parent volunteer checks the recorded messages each morning and compares the message with the morning attendance. Any discrepancies are followed up on immediately;
- ◆ Any students who are late or who leave early MUST report to the office in order to maintain accurate attendance records.

TRAFFIC / SAFETY, DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP REMINDERS

- ◆ Please be reminded that children should not be dropped off any earlier than **8:10 a.m.** and need to be picked up in the afternoon preferably by **3:00 p.m. and no later than 3:10 p.m.** There is no supervision before or after these times. If for some unforeseen reason you cannot pick your child up by 3:10 p.m. please call the office and let Mrs. Matthews know.
- ◆ Please be **extra cautious** when driving to and from school and when driving in our school driveway. As well:
 - ◆ Enter our driveway slowly and do not enter the parking lot through the exit driveway;
 - ◆ Please do not park in the drop-off area as this causes congestion and traffic backs up onto Central Saanich Road;
 - ◆ For long term parking, please use the visitor spots or the parking lot off East Saanich Road;
 - ◆ Please, help us to keep the good relationships we share with our neighbors by not parking in/or blocking their driveways.

If it is possible to car pool, or to walk with your children to school, please consider this as it will reduce the volume of traffic around the school.

CRIMINAL RECORD CHECKS (CRC)

At June's Board Meeting, the Saanich Board of Education approved the Policy 5540 (Criminal Record Review for Staff and Volunteers)

1. If you had a Criminal Record Check done for the 2010/11 school year, it will be valid for an additional 12 months;
2. If you believe you may volunteer in any capacity, including driving, starting in September 2011 and you have NOT yet submitted a CRC to the school district, we are requesting that you do so as soon as possible. There can be significant delays (up to 120 days) for some application so it is recommended that potential volunteers begin the process now;
3. Parents can obtain a letter from the school office that will allow them to obtain a CRC with NO fee (this letter can be requested by email, phone call or by stopping by the school office);
4. Parents are required to go to the police station in the municipality in which they live, provide photo ID and complete the CRC application at that location;
5. The completed CRC needs to be submitted to the School Board Office at 2125 Keating X Rd. CRC can be dropped directly the School Board Office or at the school office (would then be forwarded to the board office in the inter-school mail);
6. When the volunteer's name is added to the Volunteer List, he/she can volunteer anywhere in the school district for up to 2 years.
